# Grand Knight's Report (cont'd)

This past January 18th, the March for Life happened in Washington DC. We, as a council, did a Novena for Life with the help of the United States Conference of Bishops, to take the time to pray for the respect of life in all forms. We know that our Christian identity calls us to divine intimacy and true communion with God and closeness in him through daily prayer, along with the reading of scriptures and participation in the sacraments.

Being a disciple of Christ includes sharing the Gospel with others and inviting others to a deeper relationship with God. When we live in union with God, we are open to his prompting and able to see the opportunities to witness his guidance in responding to these opportunities.

How can we as Knights, continue to open our eyes to the culture we live amongst and help create a culture of life? Today, society is trying desperately to promote abortion, assisted suicide, and a general disregard for life. Society is promoting a culture of death.

How can we as Knights do small things with great impact to help create or improve a culture of life? We have within our own Faith and Action initiatives to affect the awareness for life. One of our brothers and his wife support a prison ministry. Several our brothers pray the Rosary at abortion clinics. Several of our brothers support the Alhambra and the intellectually impaired. Some of our Brothers and their families attended the March for Life (Mike Kramp and Tim Dorweiler), These are just a few examples of some of the way the St Francis Council support a culture a life!

In a world in which the most vulnerable are so often overlooked and disregarded, Christ calls us to embrace and uphold the unconditional dignity of every human life. In doing so, we help build a new culture of life, the fruit of the culture of truth and of love. (Evangelium vitae '77)

A recap of the topics that the Novena that our council shared is as follows:

Day 1 – Culture of Life. Day 2 – Respect for those with Intellectual Abilities. Day 3 – Prayers for those who experienced sexual abuse. Day 4 – Prayer for those who considered and followed thru with adoption. Day 5 – Prayer for those who suffered a loss of child thru abortion. Day 6 – Prayers for the victims of human trafficking. Day 7- Prayer for those hoping to conceive or adopt a child. Day 8 – Prayer for those nearing the end of their natural life, that they may receive medical care that respects their dignity and protects their lives Day 9 – Prayer for the legal protection for unborn children.

Participating in the Novena was an eye opening experience. The greatest compliment that was shared with me was from a few the wives of our Knights, as many of you, thankfully, were able to share this experience with your families.

I am happy to report that St. Francis Council is 100% to plan for our Faith and Action program.

We will be having a first degree on Feb 20<sup>th</sup>. I encourage you to do your best to tell our story to someone you believe would help us continue the growth of St. Francis Council.

My Brother Knights,

Vivat Jesus!

On January 16<sup>th</sup>, the Senate passed a resolution saying it would be "unconstitutional" to consider membership in the Knights of Columbus a disqualifying criteria for public office. The resolution passed by unanimous consent, meaning it went unopposed by senators of either party.

The resolution was drafted and introduced by Sen. Ben Sasse (R-NE) in response to <u>recent questions</u> put to a judicial nominee, which suggested membership in the Knights could prevent someone serving impartially as a judge. Citing the protection of religious liberty in the Constitution, the resolution noted that past candidates, including President John F. Kennedy, had suffered from "significant anti Catholic bigotry."

"It is the sense of the Senate that disqualifying a nominee to Federal office on the basis of membership in the Knights of Columbus violates clause 3 of article VI of the Constitution of the United States," the resolution states. Article VI includes the provision that "no religious test shall ever be required as qualification to any office or public trust under the United States."

On Dec. 5, Senators Mazie Hirono (D-HI) and Kamala Harris (D-CA) raised concerns about membership in the Knights of Columbus while the Senate Judiciary Committee reviewed the candidacy of Brian C. Buescher, an Omaha-based lawyer nominated by President Trump to sit on the United States District Court for the District of Nebraska. In her questions to Buescher, Hirono said that the Knights have "taken a number of extreme positions." Harris used her questions to label the organization as "opposed a woman's right to choose" and against "marriage equality," and suggested that Buescher could be unable to give a fair hearing to cases on these issues. It is sad that in this day and age, we must face the fact that we, as Catholics are under attack due to our beliefs. Our Lord knew of these attacks and prepared us in the Gospel of John. In Chapter 15 verses 18-19, our Lord said:

"If the world hates you, realize that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, the world would love its own; But because you do not belong to the world, and I have chosen you out of the world, the world hates you."

We as Knights must boldly proclaim our love of Jesus and His Church to the world! We must be ready for the persecution that lies ahead of us and boldly and lovingly proclaim that Jesus is ... *"the way, the truth and the light!"* 

We must be the strong right arm of the Church and stand with her protecting her and following her, whatever the cost.

These are the promises of all Knights! This is the duty of all who are "practical Catholics!"

On March 2<sup>nd</sup>, there will be a 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Exemplification held and DiCarlo's Banquet Center in Warren. There are only two 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Exemplifications held in this area each year. I encourage all my 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Brother Knights to join with us and fulfill your duty as Knights to study the lessons of Patriotism. Join us as a 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knight so that you may "Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil. 
