Dr. Kenney will hold a presentation on Thursday March 7th at Our Lady of Good Council which will include a preview of the movie. The goal is to have an across the nation release on Friday March 29th. Please keep the makers of this movie in your prayers as this nation continues to understand the true effects of this genocide called abortion. Keep praying that Roe vs. Wade is overturned soon.

Our Council will be conducting our 3rd and 4th Fish Fry's on April 5th and 12th. We will hold recruitment during these events. The charity of our time, our unity of working together and our fraternity will all be on display as we cook and serve approximately 1000 meals per evening.

MOTION TO DONATE \$1000 to the Corner Shower Project

St. Francis Council agreed to a motion to donate 1000 to the Corner Shower project that is helping the less fortunate in a very impoverished area of Detroit to get cleaned up and get a set of fresh clean clothes while they eat their meal at the Mana Meal center located in the basement of St. Peters Church in the Corktown area of the city. This writing serves as the official notice of the intent of the council. A vote to approve the motion will occur at the March 6th meeting.

Officer Responsibilities

In April, we will hold nominations for the officers of this council. If you are interested in running for a position, let it be known during the May nominations process.

Grand Knight. The GK is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over the council meeting and acts as a member of all committees, appoints membership and program directors, insure all reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council.

Deputy Grand Knight. The DGK is second in command. He assists the GK with council affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the GK. Should a GK be absent from a council meeting, the DGK will preside. He will set the agenda for the officers meeting.

Chancellor. The chancellor primary goal is to assist the GK and DGK in the execution of their duties in both their absences. The chancellor shall start and end the council and officer meetings in prayer, either from script or written by themselves.

Recorder. The recorder is similar to a court recorder or secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council thru the council minutes. He is also responsible to provide minutes for review prior to each council meeting.

Treasurer. The treasurer is responsible for the safe keeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides certificate of such monies to the GK

Financial Secretary. The FS is **appointed** by the Supreme Knight upon recommendations of the council. He maintains all financial and membership records. He collects and receives all moneys from all sources, including dues from member.

Lecturer. The lecturer is **appointed** by the GK to provide educational and educational programs to the council.

Advocate. The advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council.

Warden. The warden is the watchdog of the council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the FS., treasurer and recorder. He is responsible for setting up the council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. The warden will supervise the guards.

Inside and Outside Guards. The guards have similar responsibilities primarily admitting visitors and checking credentials.

Board of Trustee's. There are 3 members elected by the council who oversee the work of the FS, secretary and treasurer. They propose and maintain the council budget and review all vouchers for accuracy.
