

My Brother Knights,

Vivat Jesus!

There's a song written and sung by Country music artist Alan Jackson that asks: "Where were you when the world stopped turning, that September day?"

For many of us, Tuesday, September 11th, 2001 will be a day that will be forever etched into our minds. For me, I was at work when I heard the news report that at 8:46 am, American Airlines Flight 11 had crashed into the north tower of the World Trade Center. Thinking to myself what a horrible tragedy this was, I didn't truly understand the events that were taking place. A short time later, reports came in that at 9:03 am, United Airlines Flight 175 had crashed into the South tower. I remember the fear I felt, coming to the realization that our nation was under attack. My first thoughts were to pray for our country, those who had already lost their lives, those trying to escape the terror unfolding around them, and for the protection of my family and friends. Events started becoming surreal when at 9:37 am, we heard of further reports of a third plane, American flight 77 crashing into the Pentagon. And then later, of the 40 heroic passengers and crew of United flight 93 who lost their lives at 10:07 am as the terrorists crashed the plane into a field while passengers attempted to retake the plane. This plane's target would have been the White House.

I remember getting a TV setup in our office and watching in horror at 9:59 am when the South Tower came crashing to the ground, understanding the massive loss of life that had just occurred. I remember all too well watching the North tower coming down just 30 minutes later and, in almost in a state of disbelief, thinking to myself "This can't be happening!" The days following September 11th were strangely quiet as all planes were grounded. Travelers struggled to find any mode of transportation that would get them home to their loved ones. Churches were filled with people imploring God for protection, and asking for His comfort on those who were hurt or lost loved ones. On that day, in the span of 2 hours, nearly 3000 lives were lost, and 6000 people were injured. Crews worked feverishly in the wreckage to try and find survivors, and miraculously, 20 people were pulled from the rubble of those collapsed buildings.

By a resolution of Congress, September 11th has been designated as "Patriots Day" All Americans are asked to fly their flags at half-staff (if possible), and beginning at 8:46 am, for all to offer a moment of silence praying for all those affected by this terrorist attack on our Country. Please remember to join with Americans all around the Country to remember all those who lost their lives or have suffered from this attack!

There will be an exemplification (initiation) of members wishing to join the Fourth Degree on Saturday, September 14th. This will be held at De Carlos banquet center in Warren, MI. There is still time if any 3rd degree member would like to join us and take their final Knighthood degree. The Knights of the 4th degree will always remember in our prayers all Americans who have been lost in the service of, or in the attack of our Country. I ask you all to join us!
