Brother Knights - Vivat Jesus


We hope each of you have had a great Advent preparation and Christmas. 2020 is now here.


Our council is 80% complete on its faith and action goals. Thank you to all who have helped us thus far.

Father Loren O'Dea Memorial Scholarship 2020 Fall School Year

Dear Brother Knights,

Many of you remember, and more of you have heard about, the beloved and now deceased Chaplain of our council, Father Loren O'Dea. With a career as a social worker and then as a priest, Father O'Dea knew the importance of a college education. With that in mind and to honor Father O'Dea in a meaningful manner, St. Francis Council #4401 has initiated a scholarship program in his honor.

Here's a quick summary of this program:

A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a highly qualified student for the 2020-2021 academic year.

The scholarship will be awarded to a child or grandchild, of a living or deceased member in good standing of St. Francis Knights of Columbus Council #4401.

In order for the applicant to be considered for the scholarship, the St. Francis Council Knight must have been a member in good standing for at least (1) one year.

Scholarship applications will be available after January 2, 2020.

Applicants for the scholarship must be a high school senior and have a minimum 2.5 GPA.

The scholarship application must be submitted and post marked no later than March 31, 2020.

Scholarships will be awarded not later than May 15th, 2020.
