Maybe a small act of kindness is in fact the Holy Spirit telling you, "do this small deed for this stranger. Do this small act of kindness because this person needs to see that there is more to the world than just hate." So here's my Christmas challenge to all my Brother Knights: one small act for a total stranger this December. No, you don't need to buy presents for the entire children's hospital. But be on the lookout for that one small thing the Holy Spirit calls on you to do. The one little thing that might show someone who believes they live in a world of hate that there is kindness... and without saying one word you may convince them otherwise.

Last week marked the first day of opening arguments in the Supreme Court case of Dobbs vs Jackson, the largest and most impactful abortion related case the United States has seen in decades. This case, originating in Mississippi, will decide the fate of Roe vs Wade for at least the next few decades and is expected to be argued for the next few months. There are a lot of excuses that the other side comes up with when trying to justify abortion. A few of them can be sensitive or uncomfortable to debate but probably the worst among them is that no life is better than a poor life. That it's somehow humane to spare a child from dysfunction or from being an inconvenience. That somehow having an abortion is merciful, like putting down a dog when he's become too old to go on. Wherever this case in the Supreme Court lands - our fight on the side of life will not be over. Overturning Roe v Wade sounds like a monumental victory... but the truth is that's when the fight will get its ugliest. When states will have to have their own abortion debates and pass their own new legislation. That's when the worst arguments will be at the forefront and when the worst attitudes about abortion will be on display.

Members are also known as the Visitandines or Visitation Sisters.
